Implementing Agency: International Organization for Migration (IOM)

Partner institution: Ministry of Defence of the Republic of Serbia (MoD) – PRISMA Programme (Programme for Resettlement in the Serbian Army)

Duration: The project is designed for a period of five years. The fourth year of project implementation ongoing (1 July 2009 – 30 June 2010).

Target Group: Within the five year period, up to 5,100 discharged defence personnel categorized as "high risk" by the Ministry of Defence of Serbia, as well as their families and dependencies.

Target Area: The territory of the Republic of Serbia through four IOM/MoD regional offices established in Belgrade, Niš, Novi Sad and Kraljevo.

Overall Objective: Assistance to discharged defence personnel for sustainable reintegration into civilian life within the scope of defence sector reform in Serbia.

Strategic Objectives:

- Assistance to discharged defence personnel in the process of their reintegration into civilian life
- Increase capacity of PRISMA/MoD in providing reintegration assistance to discharged defence personnel
- Contribute to the implementation of defence sector reform process in Serbia
